Shelby puts blast on Big Red, 42-7

It was supposed to be a battle to prove who was number one, to prove who was the hard-hittingest, superduperest 3-A football team in the Southwestern 3-A Conference and perhaps the Old NorthState.

If the designation as the state's best 3-A team was indeed up for grabs Friday night at Lineberger Stadium in Belmont, the Shelby Golden Lions proved beyond any reasonable doubt that they are indeed deserving of their number one ranking in one newspaper

Behind the game-breaking runs of scatback Anthony Webber, who gained 191 yards on just 14 carries and would have had many more had his runs not kept ending in touchdowns, the Lions completely outclassed the homestanding South Point Red Raiders, 42-7, as an overflow crowd of more than 6,500 fans watched in disbelief as Shelby advanced tothe state playoffs by humiliating the Raiders in the battle of unbeatens.

South Point Coach Jim Biggerstaff's bid for an unbeaten season, conference title and an attempt to end the '77 season' with his 77th victory in his nine years at South Point was doomed almost from the first time Shelby touched the ball.

Lester Jamerson returned a Mitch Painter punt 34 yards to the South Point 36 to give the Lions excellent field position, an important advantage that they enjoyed throughout the contest. On Shelby's first play from scrimmage, back-up fullback Scott Bankhead, starting in place of power-running Alan Burrus, exploded through a giant hole in the middle of the Red Raider line and galloped 36 yards untouched to paydirt.

On South Point's next two possessions the Saiders furned the ball over as the Saiders furned the ball over aerial and Hugh Howell recovered a Fernandez Grier fumble at the Raider eight.

Three plays later, Bankhead crashed over from the one, and David Devine's second of five successful

placements gave the Lions a commanding 14-0 lead with 1:45-remaining in the initial stanza.

If first-year Coach Jim Taylor's unbeaten season was not already assured, when the curtain opened on the Anthony Webber Show in the second period, the Lions, who won the Western North Carolina High School Activities Association title in the organization's last year of existence a year ago, were ready to begin thinking about their bid for the state 3-A title this season.

Webber scored on dashes of 29 and 18 yards in the second quarter as Shelby mounted effective drives from 56 and 54 yards from the goal line to take a 28-0 halftime advantage.

The Shelby offensive and defensive lines, which punished their South Point counterparts throughout the encounter, continued to control the action — with a little help from Webber — in the second half.

A Painter punt that traveled 54 yards to the Shelby seven but the Lions at a disadvantage late in the third period, but Webber found a hole in the middle of the line and dashed 93 yards for his third touchdown with 2:18 remaining in the period.

Shepherd was pounded throughout the night by the Shelby defensive line, as the Lions sacked the Raider quarterback five times for losses totalling 31 yards, but he did have his moments of glory. He completed seven of his 22 passes for 140 yards, and his over-the-middle toss to Mitch Painter for 70 yards gave the Raiders their only touchdown with 1:42 to play in the third period.

The Shelby reserves put the final touchdown on the board by recovering a Shepherd fumble at the Raider 14 and scoring three plays later on Landrum Miller's two-yard dive with 57 seconds to play. South Point's heralded running backs, Steve Davis and Grier, were helpless against the Shelby defense. Each carried the ball but five times, with Davis getting but 12 yards and Grier. 11.

While Shelby was piling up 328 yards on the ground, with Bankhead's

69 yards on 13 carries lending support to Webber's 191, the Raiders could manage but 32 yards on the ground in 26 tries.

Perhaps the halftime show was most indicative of the outcome.

The Red Raider band played the theme from Rocky, and both bands played the theme from Star Wars.

Like Rocky Balboa, the Raiders got in but one punch — their long touchdown — in the mismatch, and although South Point's light show during the theme from Star Wars was Indeed magnificent, only the Golden Lions had the force with them on Fri-
