South Point Falls...Forestview Prevails, 41-21

Three things are guaranteed at every football game played. A coin will be tossed, a whistle will sound the start of play, and a final horn will signal a game's end. What happens in between rests entirely on the shoulders of the players. And if the load is too great to carry, adjustments are necessary. The Red Raiders carried an expectation of continued dominance into the contest against the Forestview Jaguars. But following a Raiders' three-and-out and a quick strike on the Jaguars next possession, the tone for the battle had been set. The first quarter ended with Forestview ahead 17-7.

On a drive that began in the first stanza, Forestview extended their advantage to 24-7 three minutes into the second. By this time the inability of the Red 'O' to stay on the field was having an adverse effect on the Red 'D' in terms of trying to stop the Jaguars attack. A 36-yard field goal pushed the lead to 27-7 for Forestview. A one yard plunge by QB Javus Davis closed the gap to 27-14 and this score would send the teams to the half.

Forestview padded their lead on the opening drive of the third quarter. Davis punched through on a 5-yard run to close within 34-21, but it would be the last points the Raiders would muster. The Jaguars added a touchdown early in the fourth and cruised to the victory.

Coins. whistles, and horns mark the only guarantees in a football game. The contest's outcome is based solely on the on-field effort. At 1-3 on the season, South Point is still in search of their 'A' game. It will only be realized when the team comes together and makes the decision to be as good as they can be. Coach has challenged the team. Time for eleven men to step up. And the turnaround must come this week...Stuart Cramer is on deck.
