"Red Raiders Take Care Of Business...Smash Knights, 48-0"

A Scottie Lee to Nick Muse 21 yard pass netted the game's (more appropriately South Point's) initial touchdown. The Red 'D' proved quickly to outmatch the Knights and forced a punt on Lake Norman Charter's first possession. South Point mounted a drive to the LNC 22 and would attempt a field goal. Unfortunately the kick was into a gusty wind and while hit squarely and on target would fall a few yards short of the mark. The failure of the scoring threat would be one of two small victories for the Knights (the other being 00:00 showing on the game clock!). Once again the Raiders defense proved their overwhelming dominance. Standing just inside his twenty vardline, return specialist Max Mead fielded the LNC punt at the South Point nineteen. Weaving his way through traffic and following some outstanding blocks, Mead returned the punt 81 yards for the touchdown. The Raiders had extended their lead to 14-0 with Thomas Lempereur's PAT and the rout was on! Another first quarter possession, set up by a third Knights punt, would give South Point a great opportunity to add to the advantage. Beginning at the opponents 38, the Raiders pounded out yardage to the LNC 19 yardline. From there, Jake Alexander rumbled to his first score and South Point's third of the quarter. With 9 seconds remaining in the frame the Red Raiders had pushed the lead to 21-0 and three quarters of football remained.

The onslaught that began in the first carried over into the second quarter. A reasonably promising drive by the Knights was thwarted by a Max Mead interception. South Point took over at their 40 and efficiently marched to the LNC two. From there, Alexander bulled through the line for his second touchdown and a 28-0 lead. The clock read 6:23 before the half and the

Raiders were confident that was plenty of time to add to the advantage. They were right! A quick three-and-out possession gave the Red their next scoring chance. Burning clock and picking up yardage, the Raiders drove to the Knights eight. Alexander burst through again and the Raiders maintained command at 35-0. The teams traded turnovers in the final 1:32 and went to the intermission with South Point in full control.

To begin the third, LNC managed a drive of 15 yards to their 36 and would turn the ball over on downs. The short field assisted the Red Raiders in collecting another Alexander touchdown, a dive from the one to send the Red out to 42-0 lead. At this point the game would be played with a live clock. The teams traded a couple of possessions to finish the third and as the fourth quarter approached South Point was able to give some reps to the backups.

In the final stanza, Keaton Hale took over at quarterback and he engineered a drive from near midfield to the Raiders final score of the contest. Naseen Jones carried a chunk of the load and managed a powerful two yard burst to end all scoring. South Point had soundly defeated Lake Norman Charter 48-0 to add to their all time dominance over the Knights.

It is not unprecedented when an underdog overcomes a heavy favorite and turns the sports world upside down. Such victories are said to be of Biblical proportions in reference to David's victory over Goliath. But the gridiron is hardly a setting where good faces evil, rather it's where two teams meet with a common goal, the desire to be victorious.
